Rae Woolnough Modern felting

A fascinating demonstration of Modern Felting by Fabric Artist, Rae Woolnough, was enjoyed by a good crowd of members and visitors in March. Rae took us through the process of felting with a video presentation then a demonstration creating a handbag from beautifully soft pure merino wool. She added elements of dyed wools, silks, lace etc. She also showed us a wide variety of other items she had made from felt - hats,large exotic flowers, 3D sculptural pieces and framed 2D pieces. The group participated by creating felted circles of coloured wool that were put together to form a chain which can be seen at our Musson Lane Gallery.

As you know, our MTAS Gallery at Musson Lane, which was open every Saturday, is currently closed until further notice due to the COVID 19 restrictions. The planned April 18th changeover will not happen.

Art and craft currently on display can remain until Saturday July 4th .

CASS REPORT

The CASS committee have been working towards our 2020 events for Art at the Top, Art in the Mountains and Art Direct but have decided, sadly, that these events cannot go ahead as planned due to the pandemic currently impacting all our lives.

While a lot of work has gone into organising the venue, accommodation and tutors for Art at the Top, the uncertainty of being able to hold the event, although hopefully matters will have improved, does not provide sufficient confidence that we will all be 'safe' to enjoy such gatherings.

The good news however is that the CASS Committee have been in conversation with Gallery ONE88 and have postponed Art in the Mountains to a similar time for next year and the Stanwell Tops venue organisers have also been able to reserve our October time slot for Art at the Top in 2021.

Art Direct, as it involves visiting personal spaces and exhibitions is also not going ahead but should restrictions have lifted by then you may choose to continue with your open studios as you usually would.

The Art of Sydney has not been deferred but owing to the amount of preparation and venue deposits needed we will make that decision in August.

The AGM, usually held in August is likely to be deferred until November.

We will update our Facebook and Web site information shortly and will be looking for opportunities to continue to engage with you and your members throughout this trying time.


