Dear Members.

Penelope Oates - Mixed Media We are very excited to have Penelope Oates demonstrate Mixed Media for our next demonstration meeting.

Penelope's technical approach to her practice is highly layered

with its mix of coloured inks, acrylic paint and a trusty soldering iron which allows her to lightly etch into timber panels resulting in a distinctive, tapestry-like patina of overlapping lines.

Penelope has had an extensive and varied career in the arts spanning a period of 20 years. She completed a degree in Fine Arts in Sydney at COFA at a young age which was followed shortly by a degree in Stage and Costume design at a highly prestigious acting school, NIDA.



She worked for several years in Sydney as a designer, concept illustrator and model maker before finally completing a Diploma of Teaching in Visual Arts which has allowed her to finance her foray into her own art practice.



MTAS Committee and Volunteer Role Descriptions

The Society shall have its affairs controlled and managed by the Committee consisting of the following officers: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Assistant Secretary, Publicity Officer, Membership Officer, Functions Officer and Children's Art Classes Co-ordinator.

THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

PRESIDENT

- Oversees the operation of Macquarie Towns Arts Society.
- Presides as Chairperson for all general meetings, Committee meetings and special meetings.
- Exercises a President's casting vote in the event of an equality of votes on any question to be decided at a meeting.
- Signs the record of minutes of each meeting when minutes are confirmed at the next succeeding meeting.
- Signs official documents including all contracts entered into by the Society along with one other member of the
 executive.
- Writes a President's Report for the monthly Newsletter
- Represents the Society in the community.

VICE PRESIDENT

- Undertakes the role of President when the President is unavailable.
- Co-signs any contracts entered into by the Society as required.
- Provides advice to the Society in relation to management procedures.
- · Acts as support person to help in any management role.

SECRETARY

- · Takes the Minutes of all meetings.
- Ensures all Minutes are presented, verified and signed by President.
- Keeps a master copy record of all Minutes and supporting documents.
- Records the incoming mail after clearing the Post Office box.
- Provides a correspondence list for meetings including emails.
- Writes letters and invoices for advertisements in Newsletter.
- Ensures that members without computers receive a posted copy of Newsletter, entry forms, reminders etc.
- Liaises with Council regarding banner placement on poles.

TREASURER

- Ensures that all money due to the Society is collected and received and that all payments authorised by the Society are made.
- Note: Bills of an urgent nature should be paid at the discretion of the treasurer.
- Ensures that correct books and accounts are kept showing the financial affairs of the Society, including full details of all receipts and expenditure connected with the activities of the Society.
- Maintains custody of accounting and bank books.
- Banks all monies received and attend to all banking matters without delay.
- Presents financial statements to Committee meetings, Annual General Meetings and any Special General meeting where required.

EXTENDED COMMITTEE

ASSISTANT SECRETARY

Supports Secretary by carrying out tasks as decided by them.

ASSISTANT TREASURER

• Supports Treasurer by carrying out tasks as decided by them.

MEMBERSHIP OFFICER

- Processes all Membership Renewals and New Memberships.
- · Sends out Membership Cards.
- Maintains the Membership List and circulates a current copy to Committee monthly.

PUBLICITY OFFICER

- Responsible for placing advertisements/notices into local newspapers.
- Maintaining and updating information on all social media outlets.

FUNCTIONS OFFICER

- · Engages demonstrators for monthly meetings.
- · Organises 2-3 workshops per year.

CHILDREN'S ART COORDINATOR

• Organises after school classes and school holiday workshops, which includes liaising with tutors.

OTHER VOLUNTEER ROLES

NEWSLETTER EDITOR

- Edits and formats information submitted for "Light and Shade" by 21st of each month.
- Circulates completed Newsletter to Publicity Officer and Secretary.
- Designs and provides artwork for catalogues, flyers and posters for each exhibition.

TECHNICAL OFFICER

- Responsible for setting up the projection equipment at monthly meetings.
- · Maintains the technical equipment.

EXHIBITION MANAGER

- · Responsible for entry forms.
- · Collates entries for the catalogue.
- Organises the hanging/rejection of works, certificates, prizes etc.

EXHIBITION EQUIPMENT MANAGER

- Checks the equipment required for exhibition is placed in the appropriate crates stored and is available when required.
- Organises any transport required to move equipment.
- · Replenishes crates as required.

CATERING – SUPPER FOR DEMONSTRATION MEETINGS

- Purchases supplies for monthly meetings.
- Sets up supper table and clears it away.
- Returns tablecloth freshly laundered.

PUBLIC OFFICER

- Acts as official contact for the Society, including taking delivery of documents served on the Society and bringing them to the attention of the Committee as soon as possible.
- Notifies NSW Fair Trading of any change in the Society's official address within 28 days.

CASS REPRESENTATIVE

Represents MTAS at CASS meetings.

OPEN WEDNESDAYS COORDINATORS

- Sets up the space for carrying out of art work.
- Provides and sets up refreshments.
- Responsible for the security of the premises on that day.

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LIBRARIAN AND ARCHIVES OFFICER

- Maintains the print and audio visual collection.
- Accession, catalogue, covering and repair of books. Supervises borrowing.
- · Reviews books for Newsletter.
- Responsible for maintaining and filing the archival material.

LIFE DRAWING COORDINATOR PORTRAIT GROUP COORDINATOR

• Takes in the participants fees, books and pays the models, submits invoices for the Society to pay room hire and organise the venue.

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FRAMING REQUIREMENTS FOR RICHMOND MARKET PLACE EXHIBITION:

- All paintings under glass must be sealed with proper picture framing tape.
 (available at Richmond Art Supplies or any art shop)
 - Please note: Masking tape or packing tape on the back will not be accepted.
- No nails, screw eyes or wire.
- Proper blind cord stringing and secure stapling or "D" rings must be used.
- Any canvasses with stapling on the side edge have to be framed.
 The only unframed canvasses which will be accepted will be the wide ones, which are painted on the edge and stapled at the back.
- No repairs will be effected on anything after delivery.
- 'D' Rings are not compulsory at the Market Place Exhibition.
- Name of Artist, Title of Artwork, Price and Medium must be noted on the back of each artwork.
